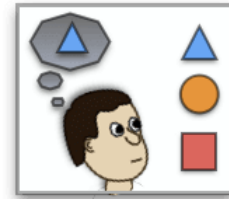
## CEA INFORMATION

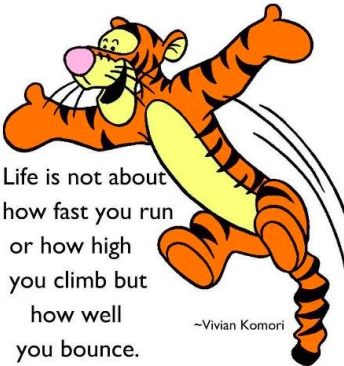
