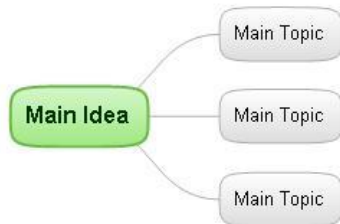

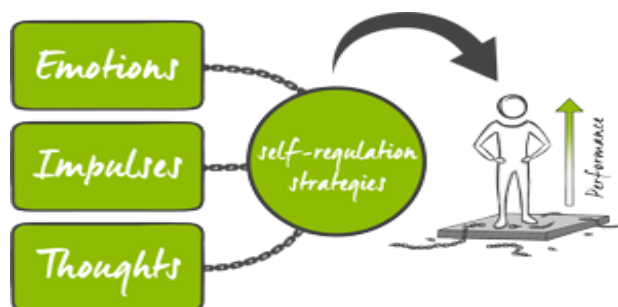
**Ideas for bridging into everyday life:**

### Are you a mother of a child diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)?

If you are, researchers at the University of the Witwatersrand are doing research to find out your experiences of raising a child with ASD.
